

USDA Income Guidelines

For The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP)

February 2022 - January 2023

Wyoming households are eligible to receive TEFAP commodities at participating food pantries if the total gross income for the household does not exceed 130% of the federal poverty level.

Eligibility is based on self-declared income.

By requesting and accepting these items, I VERBALLY CERTIFY that I am a resident of the service area of this agency and have a combined household gross monthly income that does not exceed the guidelines below.

I UNDERSTAND that I may be prosecuted under current laws for accepting food for which I am not eligible and the food I receive may not be sold, exchanged, or otherwise diverted from my household's use.

There are no income eligibility criteria for persons who voluntarily seek meals at soup kitchens or homeless shelters.
